


Eating Healthy is Good for Me... and You!

Use sunlight and chlorophyll to convert CO₂ and water to sugar, give off water to regulate temperature, give off O₂, some can produce new plants.

Supports leaves to get sunlight, transfers water and nutrients, some store liquid and food, some can produce new plants.

Produce food, oxygen and fresh air for birds, insects, and other animals, food produces new plants.


Leaves and support plants take in water and nutrients, store food, some can produce new plants.

Virtual = cloud-based

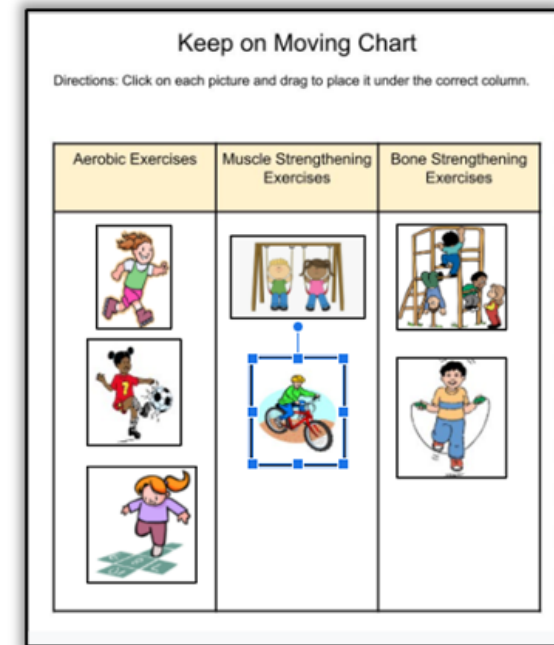
Virtual worksheets may be used when students or participants:

Determine which platform or LMS will be used:

Youth – communicate with teacher about LMS used

Sharing Google Slides/Forms with students or participants

Depending on settings, may need Google (G-mail) account

PowerPoint:

Students should be able to use if school uses Teams or Schoology

Free version of PowerPoint Online

Teacher assigns - select option 'Each student will get a copy'

Outside of Google Classroom

Teacher/educator can assign using 'force copy' link
